The audio-visual resources in this booklet are designed to help students explore:

- Themes: examine recurring themes, ideas, and motifs across different literary texts
- Characterisation: analyse the development of characters, their motivations, relationships, and conflicts within the text. They can also examine characters' traits, actions, and speeches to understand their significance in the narrative.
- Contextual understanding: explore how historical events, cultural norms, and societal values influence the themes, characters, and narratives of the texts and their adaptations.
- Critical analysis: develop skills in critical analysis and interpretation, learning
 to evaluate literary texts from different perspectives and articulate their own
 interpretations supported by evidence from the text.
- **Comparative study:** analyse and compare different literary texts or extracts to explore similarities, differences, and connections between them.

The material is designed to be easily digested by students whether they are in the classroom, at home, or on the move. Longer audio clips are perfect for listening on headphones while enjoying some fresh air.

You can share the clips with your students using our **Student Share** link on the site, allowing students to watch a clip without the need to register.


